***<u>Retaining suppliers</u>** for the gift shop has been challenging. The companies that supply our special baby products has either changed ownership or cannot supply the quality products we are looking for. As you know, we have not had a confectionary supplier for a few years and it is only thanks to the efforts of Margaret Cornies, who scours the dollar stores and big box stores, that we are able to maintain a decent supply of candies and chips. Our card supplier has also retired which has left a gap in our stock of cards. Management continues to work on these issues.

***Shoplifting** is a common curse for all retailers. Please remain aware of customers as they enter the shop and greet them with a friendly hello. Monitor the activity of each customer when possible.

*<u>A Book Cart</u> is a recent addition to our gift shop. It has a prominent position outside our shop door. Payment is by cash donation. A container for depositing the money sits on the counter behind the cash register.



We are requesting donations from our members to keep a steady supply of appropriate magazines and books on the cart. These donations can be dropped off at the Gift Shop.

Auxiliary Funded Programs

The auxiliary is proud to be funding some very special programs.



The Ballet program started a few years ago at Cottage Worthington and has recently resumed after a pause during Covid. Members recently voted to support the ballet program for 2024. This special program benefits both the young ballet students who receive free lessons from trained instructors as well as the residents who engage with the students while they are learning their dances.

Puppy Love is the other funded program that benefits Cottage Worthington. Donated funds and the Hospital Foundation also support the same program in the ACE unit of our hospital. Our Auxiliary volunteers help with these events when they occur. 8 to 10 week old puppies are brought to the respective facilities to encourage residents and patients to engage with the puppies. The program allows the patients to cuddle and hold the puppies which in turn encourages them to move about as part of their rehabilitation.



Equipment funding: At our December meeting, members agreed to support the request from FVHCF of \$10,000 for a C-Arm which is a diagnostic imaging tool required for heart procedures such as pacemakers and valve replacements.
